## California Agriculture and Farm Labor 2017

Friday, April 14, 2017

This conference examines current issues in farm labor. California's labor-intensive fruits and vegetables were two thirds of the state's \$47 billion in farm sales in 2015, average agricultural employment has been increasing to 420,000, and most farm workers are Mexican-born men who have settled in California with their families.

The focus is on four timely issues. First is the practice of fresh-produce buyers requiring growers to abide by labor and other protocols in order to sell commodities. Second is the four-S response of farmers to fewer new farm workers, including satisfying current workers, stretching them with mechanical aids, substituting machines for hand workers, and supplementing them with H-2A guest workers. Third is the status of immigrants and migration policy in the Trump administration, and fourth are ALRB activities and the status of cannabis workers.
